The objects of the Stichting for the Prevention of Conflict (the Foundation) are to financially and/or otherwise support the International Crisis Group; a corporation incorporated under the District of Columbia Nonprofit Corporation Act, D.C. Code, Title 29, Chapter 5; to achieve the objectives of heightening governments' sense of obligation to undertake effective means to prevent, mitigate and resolve large-scale humanitarian emergencies, advocate strategies and measures for early action by governments and inter-governmental organizations, strengthen the world's capability to anticipate and prevent man-made disasters, mobilize official and public support for concerted international, national and private response efforts and help increase public confidence in the international crisis system.

This includes: (i) financing or otherwise funding the International Crisis Group; (ii) borrowing, lending, and raising funds and other resources, as well as entering into agreements in connection with the foregoing activities, all for the benefit of the International Crisis Group; (iii) receiving donations, inheritances, and legacies for the benefit of the International Crisis Group; and (iv) managing and investing assets to achieve the objectives of the International Crisis Group. When are the activities carried out? The activities are conducted on a continuous basis and do not adhere to a fixed schedule. Active and ongoing efforts are devoted to securing funding and thereby supporting the International Crisis Group. How do the activities contribute to achieving the institution's objective? By supporting the International Crisis Group in its objectives, independence and even-handed access can be achieved by the organisation, yielding unique insights that inform detailed policy advice.

Within these programs, the International Crisis Group conducts field research to monitor actual and potential conflicts, produces rigorous, fact-based reports and briefings, publishes commentaries, opinion pieces, memoranda, videos and multimedia features, engages with all parties to conflicts, and undertakes direct, personal advocacy with political leaders.
